WHAT ARE TEFL AND TESOL?

TESOL stands for Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages, TEFL for Teaching English as a Foreign Language and TESL for Teaching English as a Second Language.

TEFL is mainly used in the UK and has traditionally been applied to teaching English to people for whom English is a foreign language and who will use English mainly for short-term study, work or leisure purposes. TESL has traditionally been applied to teaching English to people for whom English is a second language in their home country or people settling in an English-speaking country. TESOL is an umbrella term that now usually incorporates the other two acronyms.

Requirements for candidates for the four-week TEFL course are as follows:

- You must agree to an admissions interview before acceptance
- You must be 18 years old by the course start date
- You must have a high level of English language competence (*)
- You must have completed secondary education and have a qualification to enter higher education.

(*) Non-native English speakers can apply if they meet the requirements in the Non-native English Speakers section below.

Previous teaching experience is not a requirement. If you have experience in these areas, please include them when you apply.

- Lived, worked or travelled abroad
- Knowledge of a second language
- A degree or higher
- Work experience
- Recent additional studies
- Experience in dealing with groups of people
- Volunteer work
- Mentoring, tutoring or teaching
- Teaching experience

You must also show serious intent to use your teacher training in a realistic way for your career development.

Non-native English Speakers

You may be required to show one of the following:

- A degree from a university in one of the following countries: Australia, Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, United Kingdom or the United States of America
- Cambridge CPE (Certificate of Proficiency in English)
- IELTS level 6
- TOEFL (minimum scores 525 on the paper-based test or 80 on the computer-based test)

TRINITY CERTPT MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

EBC complies with Trinity College London entry requirement standards. You must meet Group 1 or Group 2 requirements.

- 1. Group 1 completed an initial certificate or qualification in education, TEFL or TESOL and have at least six months of classroom or online teaching experience
- 2. **Group 2** at least two years teaching experience

Non-native English speakers are accepted with a minimum English ability of B2 on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages scale.





WHAT IS AN ENGLISH TEACHING JOB LIKE?



The English teaching experience is different in every country, as each has its unique **culture**. However, no matter where you go, you will have a mix between **teaching and exploring** a new culture

It depends a lot on where and whom you teach, but you'll be expected to know your subject, plan and deliver coherent classes and behave professionally. If you teach for a language school, you may get to teach in their classrooms, or you may get sent to a client's site to teach in an office or sometimes in their home. If you teach for a state school, then you will teach classes of children during normal school hours.

Like all jobs, teaching can be stressful at times, but as long as you're prepared, you will be OK. You will get people in class that are difficult to deal with, but your Trinity CertTESOL course teaches you the basic skills to deal with these situations.


Teaching can be very rewarding and very satisfying, but something never to be forgotten is that you get out of it what you put into it.

There are jobs of all shapes and sizes available ranging for working for private language schools through to state schools; however the door will always be open to someone with an accredited certificate like the Trinity CertTESOL. An accredited certificate, like the Trinity CertTESOL will enable you to work for almost any language school that you choose in almost any country in the world.

You'll be able to teach to students of all ages and social status. This largely depends on your personal choice. Additionally, the Trinity CertTESOL is accepted by the British Council, an organisation that has branches in over 109 countries.

There is a constant requirement for qualified ESOL/ESL EFL teachers so finding a job after taking a the Trinity CertTESOL course is virtually guaranteed.

HOW ABOUT PAY AND WORKING CONDITIONS?



The only thing for certain is that you will get paid in the local currency of the country where you are teaching, Euros, Baht, Yen etc. With the exception of some countries in the Far East, you will need to make your own arrangements for finding work, accommodation, etc. Most countries in the Far East require prospective teachers to have a degree.

The payment cycle will probably be monthly, it certainly is throughout Europe. Standard practice is that you turn in timesheets at the end of each month and you get paid about a week later.

Employee benefits depend on the type of job you have. If you work freelance (usually pays better) then you have to arrange for your own. If you have a fixed contract, benefits are normally included. It's best to get these details ironed out with the school before you commit to a teaching position.

The location that you teach in depends on the type of school you work for. Teaching locations can include the following:

- The school's own classrooms
- A training room or office in a company building
- A client's home or other pre-agreed location if you teach private classes

You may have to pay tax and social security in the country where you work. You may also need to file an income tax return in your home country so it's best to check with your local tax office before you leave.

In almost all cases, English teachers earn a decent wage when compared to locals as you will be a rare commodity.


Many are not aware of the many jobs available in TEFL and TESOL. There are TEFL teachers worldwide working in elementary and high schools, but there are potentially more opportunities for all TEFL and TESOL teachers in:

- language schools (from the SME (Small and Medium Enterprise) to internationally recognised chain schools
- international schools
- secondary/high schools
- kindergartens
- universities/colleges
- government-sponsored programs (e.g. Peace Corps, JET, British Council)
- corporate in-house training
- freelance/private teaching
- voluntary work for charitable organisations

WHO WILL MY STUDENTS BE?

They can vary. An excellent educational organisation or school will match an EFL/ESL teacher's skills and experience with the appropriate ELL (English Language Learner). The more flexible you are, the more hours you will get. Based on your capabilities, expertise and your **TEFL certification**, you could be asked to teach:

- Students of all levels from the A1-A2 (Beginner) to C1-C2 (advanced or almost bi-lingual students) of all ages (toddlers to octogenarians)
- Group classes (from 2 or 3 in a language school to 50 or more in a secondary/high school)
- One-to-one (usually the high-ups in the company hierarchy, the big bosses!)
- General English (4 skills Reading, Writing, Speaking and Comprehension or Listening)
- Public exam preparation
- Academic English
- Business English or ESP (not Extra sensory power) English for specific purposes
- English tutoring at the student's home



- The number of years the school has been running
- Working schedule, which will include classroom hours, meetings, lesson planning, travel time
- Class sizes
- Teaching resources and technology
- Accommodations
- Photos of the school (the actual building that you will be working in)
- Holidays
- Continuous professional training
- Starting and finishing times (e.g. split shifts)
- What your working days will be
- Other duties (e.g. level testing, PTAs, sales)





ARE THERE WARNING SIGNS, OR HOW I CAN TELL IF THE JOB OFFER IS A SCAM?

Some of the more obvious warning signs:

- Advertising for a suspiciously large number of teachers
- Too good to be true conditions (especially if the job is offered to people with no TEFL/TESOL certification or teaching experience)
- Jobs that don't ask for qualifications or experience
- TEFL or TESOL job offers to teachers from developing countries who can't usually get a working visa
- Job offers in the EU to Americans with little experience or no TEFL certification
- Asking for copies of university degrees too early in the application process
- Asking for original certificates
- The organisation uses email addresses from providers like Hotmail, Gmail or Yahoo
- No address or telephone number on the website
- The only contact detail is a mobile/cell number
- A poorly designed website
- The website is full of grammar, spelling and vocab errors (if they are advertising for English teachers, they should be well versed in English; otherwise, who does the interviewing?)
- No website
- Asking for money The school will pay recruiters and agents, which will pay for all visa expenses. Only send copies of certificates.
 Original certificates can be presented upon arrival in the country.

I DON'T HAVE A DEGREE. HOW CAN I TEACH ENGLISH ABROAD?


While many countries want their English teachers to have a degree, there are still plenty of countries where you can find work. If you don't have a degree, don't let that stop you from teaching English abroad!

We're not going to lie to you: not having a degree can put you at a disadvantage. Many of the most popular destinations for teaching English abroad require teachers to have a degree due to visa requirements. But don't let that discourage you because options are still available. Many countries that will require a degree from their teachers can also overlook this if you have a British Council, internationally recognised and accepted TEFL certificate. The Trinity CertTESOL awarded by Trinity College London has been around since 1872, and that's a good 150 years of reputation behind their certificate.

The Trinity Certificate in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (CertTESOL) is a TESOL or TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language) certificate designed for people with little or no experience teaching English and those with experience who require an internationally recognised initial teacher education qualification.

The CertTESOL is rated at Level 5 on the UK's Ofqual Regulated Qualifications Framework, a comparable level to the second year of an undergraduate degree, and comprises a minimum of 130 hours, with an expected minimum of 70 hours of further study required (Total Qualification Time: 200 hours).

WHERE CAN I TEACH ENGLISH WITHOUT A DEGREE?

Some countries might be off the cards if you don't have a degree, but thankfully there are still great options out there! Here they are:

Europe

Irish citizens can live and work in any EU country without visa restrictions. Unless specified by an employer, a degree isn't necessary. Spain, Italy, Germany, and The Czech Republic are your best options for finding a TEFL job in Europe without a degree.

If you're not an EU citizen, it's a lot more tricky to find work teaching in Europe – degree or no degree! But, again, there are options around this.

Central and South America

There is a wide range of opportunities across Central and South America. Demand for English teachers has been steadily increasing worldwide, particularly in areas such as Business English.

In Central and South America: Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Nicaragua, Peru, Mexico, and Uruguay, it is possible to TEFL without a degree.

Cambodia

Looking at the TEFL jobs, you'll probably have noticed the abundance of positions in Asia. Unfortunately, the opportunities for TEFL without a degree in Asia are minimal. Still, there is one great option open to you – Cambodia!

Considering the high demand for teachers, incredible culture, and easy access to travel across Southeast Asia, it's not hard to see why Cambodia is an attractive option for EFL teachers.





What is the difference between TESOL, TEFL and TESL?

TESOL stands for Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages, TEFL for Teaching English as a Foreign Language and TESL for Teaching English as a Second Language.

TEFL is mostly used in the UK and has traditionally been applied to teaching English to people for whom English is a foreign language and who will use English largely for short-term study, work or leisure purposes. TESL has traditionally been applied to the teaching of English to people for whom English is a second language in their home country, or people who are settling in an English-speaking country. TESOL is an umbrella term that now usually incorporates the other two acronyms.

Is there an age limit for taking an EBC course?


Trinity will allow someone to attend who is at least 18 years old on the course start date.

Do I need teaching experience to take an EBC course?

You do not need teaching experience to take the Trinity CertTESOL course. It is designed for those with little or no English teaching experience. You do need teaching experience to take the Trinity CertPT.

Can I take the course if English is not my first language?

English does not have to be your first language. However, you must demonstrate high English skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing, whether it is a first, second or foreign language for you.



Are the Trinity CertTESOL and CertPT certificate recognised courses?

Trinity College London certificates are qualifications for English language teaching in the UK and internationally.

The <u>British Council</u> accepts them for teachers in its accredited schools in the UK and overseas in over 109 countries. Many other state and independent teaching organisations accept Trinity College London qualifications.

Credits are awarded towards degree programmes offered by universities in the UK.

Trinity College London TESOL qualifications are UK Ofqual accredited.

• CertTESOL: Level 5

• CertPT: Level 6

• Diploma TESOL: Level 7

Teachers hoping to teach in state education (primary, secondary, tertiary) should always check the requirements before taking a training course.

Trinity College London qualifications are accepted by most employers worldwide. Additionally, they are accepted by the British Council for teachers in their worldwide network of accredited schools.

Do I have to take an examination at the end of the course?

On the CertTESOL course, you will have to produce five written assignments during the course, including a test of grammar and phonology. You will also have to complete a minimum of six hours of teaching practice with genuine learners of English. All the above must be completed to Trinity standards, and you will be given professional guidance and support. You will also attend an external moderation where the Trinity College independent moderator asks you questions about your Unit 4. She/He determines if you pass the course.

On the CertPT course, you will have to produce four written assignments during the course. All assignments must be completed to Trinity standards, and you will be given professional guidance and support. Your four written tasks (assignments) will be submitted to Trinity College for external moderation. Trinity College reviews your work and checks if our marking corresponds to theirs. If it does, you pass the CertPT course.

How long will it take to receive my results and certificate?

CertTESOL

We will let you know your result on the last day of the course when the external moderation and assessment confirm your result. Certificates are then issued to us 4-6 weeks after the end of the course. We'll let you know by email when your certificates have arrived. You may pick them up or have them mailed to you.

CertPT

Due to Trinity College London limitations, we file your work for certification when we reach the Trinity required minimum of five submissions or quarterly (every three months), whichever happens first. The quarterly submission dates are the first working day of January, April, July and October.

What is the difference between Celta and the Trinity CertTESOL?

CELTA (Certificate in English Language Teaching to Adults) is a similar teacher training qualification to the Trinity CertTESOL.

Although similar in their content, mode of delivery and assessment, the two courses differ in more specific components and types of independent moderation and assessment.

Trinity emphasises reflective journal writing, professional development and self-evaluation. Trinity moderation also differs. The Trinity moderator marks one of your course units, but the CELTA moderator does not.

The British Council accepts both courses as TESOL or TEFL qualifications for teachers in its accredited UK institutions and overseas teaching operations.

If you do more research, you will find that the Trinity CertTESOL is easier on your budget than the CELTA.

Are the CertTESOL and CertPT accredited on a a government qualifications framework?

Yes, both are accredited and governed by the UK government's Ofqual regulator. Ofqual is the "Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation". It regulates qualifications, exams and tests.
